




Vision of the Institution:

To make Goswami Ganesh Dutt Sanatan Dharam College, Hariana an epicenter of brilliance imparting accessible quality education and providing opportunities for students to realize their competence, ensuring that learning leads to eternal glory.

- To provide a gateway of higher and skill-oriented quality education to economically weaker and socially backward people of 'kandi area'.
- To inculcate creativity and critical thinking in order to encourage logical decision making and innovation.
- To focus on all aspects of character building and produce enthusiastic, morally upright, ethically driven, socially sensitive and responsible citizens.
- To induce responsiveness in students towards environment, nature and biodiversity and work towards environmental regeneration.

Goswami Ganesh Dutt Sanatan Dharam (G.G.D.S.D.) College, Hariana, which was originally founded as Hindu National (H.N.) College in 1945 in Lyallpur (now in Pakistan), was rehabilitated after partition in Hariana, by the 'messiah' of the common man 'Karam Yogi' Tyagmurthi Goswami Ganesh Dutt Ji Maharaj, the then General Secretary of Shri Sanatan Dharma Pratinidhi Sabha (Punjab) Lahore.

The College was relocated in Hariana with the explicit objective of satiating the thirst of the poor, depressed and backward people, esp. womenfolk of Hariana, and its surrounding '*Ilaqa'* for the higher education.

Evidently, with the passage of time, the outlook of this institution has also changed. The college has as its new goal, envisaged the provision of quality education, general and vocational, to make it employment oriented, to develop the rational outlook of the students and to make them capable of catching with the fast-developing world.

The college is affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh for B.A. and B.Sc. (Non-Medical), B.Sc. (Agriculture)*, B.Sc. with Computer Science, P.G.D.C.A. and M.A.-I & II in the subjects of Punjabi & History, B.C.A. & B.Com. and two Add -On Courses (Human Rights & Value Education and Web Designing & Multimedia) & PG Diploma in Marketing Management & Applied Agriculture, B.Voc (Hardware & Networking), B.Voc (Banking & Financial Services) & Advanced Diploma in Organic Farming, Two new Skill Based courses, (i) Certificate Course in Mushroom Cultivation (ii) Certificate Course in Office Automation and E-Governance and Agriculture (as an Elective subject) in B.A.

The college is housed in a suitable building consisting of an ultra modern hall, a Seminar hall, a sufficient number of lecture rooms, well equipped Science, Computer and Home Science laboratories and a well-stocked Post Graduate library & separate reading halls for Graduate &

Post Graduate students. The college has a Girls' Hostel, a fully furnished Gym, a Student Centre & a common room for boys. Four Rooms have been added for teachers for creating online teaching materials.

A spacious parking area has been constructed for the benefit of the students. There are adequate arrangements for N.C.C., N.S.S., Youth Welfare Activities, Physical Education, games and sports. A number of societies and clubs exist and carry out cultural and social activities for all-round development of the students. The college Main Gate dedicated to the Diamond Jubilee of the college has been constructed and inaugurated and Seminar Hall has been updated with modern facilities.

The distinctive feature of the college is that it is situated at a convenient distance from the town and is away from the din, distraction and temptation of city. The very location of the college in the natural and rural setting engenders closer contact between the teacher and the taught and the simplicity of the place exerts wholesome influence in creating congenial atmosphere for coeducation. Thus both the girl and boy students get their education in healthy surroundings and in the rural setting, enjoying the amenities of the town life as well.

The college has progressed in almost all the spheres under the dynamic leadership and blessings of Dr. Desh Bandhu, President, Shri Sanatan Dharma Pratinidhi Sabha (Pb.) New Delhi, Dr. Gurdip Kumar Sharma, General Secretary, Shri Sanatan Dharma Pratinidhi Sabha (Pb.) New Delhi & Working President, S.D. Education Board (Regd.) Chandigarh and able leadership of Principal Dr. Rajiv Kumar.

Necessary facilities are also being provided to the girl students. A separate well-furnished & spacious common room has been reserved for them in the college. Lady tutors look to their needs and progress in studies.

Scheduled Caste and Backward Class students get all kinds of facilities in the college. In addition, they are awarded the monthly stipends and scholarships by the Central or the State Government which are tenable for full course of study. Students belonging to Scheduled Caste are advised to join the college at the earliest possible as they are entitled to get their scholarship from the very date of their joining the college.

Scholarships for merit, low income group and for the sons and daughters of the teachers and freedom fighters are also available in the college. The college also manages to procure stipends for the deserving students.

Fee concessions are very generously granted to deserving students who are good at studies, games and general activities. The concessions are granted for specific terms and are subject to good conduct, satisfactory progress at studies. Remedial Coaching Classes are available for SC/ST/OBC non creamy layer students. The college has been re-accredited by NAAC with 'B+' Grade.

- 1. He/she should have been placed in compartment in <u>one subject only</u> i.e., either in first semester or second semester.
- 2. He/ she should have obtained at least 20% marks (theory+practical+internal assessment) in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment.
- 3. He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate (theory+practical+internal assessment) of examination as laid down in the relevant regulation.
- 4. The candidate securing less than 20% Marks in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment at the +2 examination under Semester System shall not be eligible to seek admission to the first year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com/B.C.A./B.B.A. courses.

LIBRARY

The college has a well-furnished Graduate & Post Graduate library and separate reading sections both for boys and girls, with a good collection of general and reference books, text books and the latest books on all subjects by renowned authors. Monthly and weekly periodicals, Punjabi, Hindi & English newspapers are also made available. Substantial amount of money has been earmarked for further addition to the library.

Books and other publications are lent for use in the library and at home according to the following rules:

- 1. The following persons are entitled to use the library:
 - (a) Students on roll of the College.
 - (b) Members of the College Staff.
 - (c) Persons specially allowed by the Principal.
- 2. Students are allowed to draw two books at a time or more with the permission of the Principal.
- 3. Students are not permitted to keep library books for more than one month. The back issue of a periodical may be issued for three days.
- 4. Books of reference, dictionaries and fresh periodicals should not be removed from the library.
- 5. A fine of 50 paise per day will be charged from students for each book kept overtime.
- 6. Anyone who loses, defaces or otherwise mutilates a book or a journal or paper by tearing or removing pages, shall have to replace it by a new one approved by the Librarian within fourteen days of the report or pay double the price as damages, in addition to any fine that may be imposed by the Principal. In case the book is one of a set and is not available separately, he/she shall have

to bear the cost of the replacement of the entire set. The borrower should, therefore, examine the book at the time of issue.

- 7. Abook can be recalled even before the expiry of its due date.
- 8. Losing the college library card will entail a fine of Rs. 50/-.
- 9. Students must return library books on the due date even if they are on leave.
- 10. Books borrowed from the library will have to be returned on or before the 31st March of every year, however a special concession can be given by the Principal.
- 11. The student who loses the diary will be held responsible for all the books issued.
- **N.B.:** Silence and proper decorum must be maintained in the library. Students found misbehaving in the library shall be seriously dealt with. Similarly any student found tearing or removing pages from newspapers and periodicals shall be heavily penalised.

Digital Library and Book Bank:

A student, if permitted, may draw text books for full session from text book section of digital library and Book Bank. A separate security and permission of the Principal is required for this purpose.

Tutorial Groups:

Students are divided into various groups and each group is under the charge of a tutor. The tutor is responsible for the welfare and progress of his/her wards. He/she can grant them leave upto three days. He/She gives necessary help and guidance to his/her wards and keeps a close eye on their conduct and intellectual advancement. When necessary, the tutor shall give warning to his/ her wards against transgressions.

Students are expected to be in touch with their tutors, through whom applications regarding leave or for any other purpose should be submitted to the Principal. Special fine of Rs. 5/- is levied for absence from group meetings and functions.

Extra Mural Activities:

The college is making rapid progress in the cultural and social activities. There are a number of societies, associations and clubs in the college. They foster a spirit of organization and co-operation among the students.

College has following Societies, Clubs & Cells:

English Literary Society, Ramanujan Mathematical Society, Homi Bhaba Physico- Chemical Society, Planning Forum, Bhartendu Hindi Parishad, Dhani Ram Chatrik Punjabi Sahitya Sabha, Political Science Society, Tansen Musical Society, Home Science Department & Human Rights Forum, Historical Society, Ankit Sadia Computer Society, Fayol Henry Commerce Society, Old Student's Association, Red Cross Society, Youth Welfare Club. N.S.S., Career Guidance, Counselling & Grievance Redressal Cell, Red Ribbon and Legal Literacy Club.

Students are encouraged to join these activities according to their aptitude and ability.

Magazine:

The college magazine 'Gitika' is published regularly with a view to provide an opportunity to students to express themselves. It has Sanskrit, Hindi, Punjabi, English, Science, Planning Forum & Computer Science Sections, each section being edited by a student editor under the supervision of a staff member of the subject concerned.

Sports:

The college games are organised and conducted under the supervision of the Deptt. of Sports which is assisted by the College Sports Committee. There are facilities for Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Badminton, Kabaddi, Hockey, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Cricket & Boxing. Strict discipline and regularity is observed in games.

Medical-Aid:

A Homeopathic Clinic has been started by the college. A doctor has been appointed to look after the health of students, members of the staff & the people of the adopted villages-Dholbaha, Janauri, Dandoh & Tappa. In each academic year, the doctor conducts at least one medical examination of all the students in the college. The result of medical check up of each student is recorded. The doctor gives such medical advice and assistance to students as he may deem fit.

N.C.C.: Now NCC is of two years course instead of three years. In first year of enrollment NCC cadet can obtain 'B' Certificate & in second year 'C' Certificate can be obtained.

Military training has been made compulsory by the University for the able bodied male & female students of UG & PG Classes vide their letter No. 2457-2657/MISC/A-67 dated 11.4.2002. P.U. has started the weightage of marks to N.C.C. Certificate holders for admission to various courses. The weightage is as follows:

- (i) 2% for 'B' Certificate holders
- (ii) 3% for 'C' Certificate holders

The college has two N.C.C. Companies attached to 12th Punjab Battalion, Hoshiarpur.

N.S.S., Youth Welfare Club and Adult Education Programme:

Students are advised to join these clubs. Camps and other activities are regularly held to channelize the exuberant energies of the youth. Their hidden potentialities are unfolded. Inter-state tours are conducted every year.

National Adult Education Programme has been started. Student Instructors are appointed to make the programme a success.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Fees and Dues:

Fees and dues once paid are not refundable. Regular printed receipts are issued by the office when the dues are paid. Receipts must be checked after obtaining it from the office. Fee can be charged in 3 instalments with the permission of the Principal.

A candidate failing to deposit the fee in time shall be fined heavily.

Change of Subjects:

Change of subjects shall be allowed within a period of one month from the date of admission. After this period, it will be allowed on payment of Rs. 50/- per subject at the student's own risk. After the change has been sanctioned by the Principal, it is the responsibility of the student concerned (i) to get his/her name struck off the attendance register of the subject given up, (ii) to get his/her name entered in the attendance register of the subject now taken. Every student will have to apply (on prescribed proforma) in duplicate to the Principal for his permission to change the subject and he/she will show one copy of permission to the lecturer concerned for verification and necessary action.

Absence Fine:

Students absenting themselves from the College without permission will be fined as under:

(a)	For Absence for one period	50 Paise

(d)	For Absence from Science practical	Rs. 5/-

(g)	For failing in Class Test/Exam	To be decided by the Exam. Committee
(h)	Student remaining absent for more than a week	To be decided by the Discipline Committee

* Principal has unlimited powers regarding fee remission of students.

The Principal has the power to remove the name of any student from the rolls of the College, fine, rusticate or expel him/her from the college if he/she directly or indirectly takes part in any Movement or Agitation or induces directly or indirectly, any student to participate in other activity which in the opinion of the Principal is subversive to college discipline. Any campaign by means of posters or by obtaining signatures or any other means shall be interpreted as subversive activity. Students are not allowed to organise themselves into parties or groups. No meeting without the prior permission of the Principal can be held in the College Campus.

Passage in front of Principal's office is not a thorough fare.

The Principal has also the power of detaining any student of any class on account of deficiency in studies/Lectures.

If a student remains absent from college without leave for seven days continuously, his/her name will automatically be struck off from the rolls and he/she will have to seek re-admission.

College Examination

There will be two Tests, one in September/October of one hour duration and another in Feb./Mar. of three hours duration, as a result there of, 10% marks will be added towards the final score of university examinations as per University Instructions.

The defaulters shall not be allowed to appear in the Examination unless arrears are duly cleared by the 10th of the month of Examination.

The Examination shall carry 100 marks while the Class Test carry 30 marks in each subject. If a student willfully cuts the examination/class test without getting permission in writing in advance, his/her name is liable to be removed from the college rolls. Leave during examination days can be granted only by the Principal.

Roll of Honour/Medals:

Roll of honour is the highest academic award in the college and it will be conferred on :-

- 1. The students of the college securing first position in the University in any subject of Examination
- 2. All students who are placed in the Merit List.

Note:

- 1. Any student who has been punished on account of gross misconduct or found guilty of using unfair means in any examination will not be entitled to receive any prize.
- 2. The students winning 1st and 2nd prize should be getting more than 60% marks.
- 3. If in a class, the number of students is less than or equal to five then only one prize is to be awarded.
- 4. The students getting a prize must be regular in studies and should not have taken part in any movement or any agitation to stage a strike in the college for any reason (what so ever) or induce indirectly or directly any other student to participate in any other activity which, in the opinion of the Principal or the members of the staff, is subversive to college discipline.
- 5. Absence or failure in any Examination/ Class Test will debar a student from getting any academic prize.
- 6. All the staff and students are committed towards the cleanliness of the campus. Dustbins have been placed at various spots in the campus. The students are required to make the maximum use of the bins during their stay in the campus.

SCHOLARSHIPS, STIPENDS AND FEE CONCESSIONS

* Scholarship of Central or State Government:

The University, Government, Military, Scheduled Caste and Backward Class Scholarships are tenable at this college. Merit and National Scholarships offered by the Central and State government for poor and brilliant students are also available.

* Post Matric Scholarship Scheme:

Scholarships under the Government of India Post Matric Scholarship Scheme are available to Scheduled Castes/Tribes students who belong to Punjab i.e. permanently settled in the Punjab State and are pursuing their Post-Matriculation studies. The prescribed application forms and entitlement cards which such students should or are required to submit can be obtained free of cost from the college office as well as from the office of the District Welfare Officer concerned. The students should submit the application forms and entitlement cards to the college office alongwith their admission application for onward transmission to the Director of Public Instructions (College) Punjab.

* Fee Concession and Stipends for Meritorious Students:

In addition to these, fee-concession and stipends will be awarded to the students on their merit. The students belonging to the SC & Backward Classes are advised to join the college at the earliest possible, as they are entitled to get their scholarships from the very date of their joining the college.

N.B.- Stipends for O.B.C. & S.C. students are sanctioned from the date of joining.

O.B.C./SC students are advised to get a counter signature of Deputy Commissioner or G.A. to D.C. on their original Certificates.

Fee Concessions:

- 1. Fee concessions are generously granted to the deserving students by the College. Liberal financial help is also given to the poor and meritorious students to purchase text books, to meet tuition fees and other expenses (including clothing and mess) from the Students Aid and Red Cross Funds.
- 2. Application for fee concession on prescribed forms obtainable from the college office, should be submitted when called for or at the time of admission.
- 3. All the applicants for concession will be interviewed by the staff committee on a date notified by the Principal and the names of such students who are granted concession will be duly notified.

Every scholar will have to pay six month's fee at the time of the admission except students belonging to Scheduled Castes and other Backward Classes.

- 4. A student applying for the fee concession should attach with his/her application a certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended stating that he/she enjoyed concession there.
- 5. Fee concession, stipends, scholarships etc. will be withdrawn in case a scholar deteriorates in studies, remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of misbehaviour or fails in Examination/Class Tests.
- 6. In case a scholar enjoying any concession migrates or leaves the college for any reason in the midsession, he/she shall have to repay the entire amount credited to him/her by way of any concession or stipend.
- 7. Those students who are not granted fee concession at the first instance, may apply after the first Examination. Their cases will be reconsidered on the basis of their performance in the examination
- 8. Failed students are not eligible for Fee-concession.
- 9. Concession will be given to the wards of Kashmiri Displaced persons for admission to various
- 10. 50% Fee Concession will be given to the wards of Staff Members (son, daughter, brother, sister).

Attendance:

All scholars are expected to be regular and punctual in attendance. Late-comers will not be marked present. They, however, may be permitted by the class-teacher to attend a period. The Principal is fully competent to remove a scholar from the rolls of the college if he is found habitually irregular in attendance.

- 1. If a student is found habitually absent from his/her class and negligent in studies, he/she will be asked to leave the college at any time during the session.
- 2. According to the University rules, all students are required to attend at least 75% of the lectures delivered in each subject, inclusive of English Composition, Science Practicals and additional optional subjects. Attendance of 75% of N.C.C. parades is compulsory for cadets.
- 3. In addition to attending the specified percentage of lectures, a scholar has to satisfy the class teacher and the Principal by doing his/her homework regularly and showing good behaviour throughout his/her stay in the college. In the absence of the Principal's certificate to the effect, the admission form of a candidate will not be accepted by the University.
- 4. If a student falls short of lectures, condonation of shortage by the Principal, according to the University Rules, will be considered only if the reports about his studies and conduct are satisfactory.
- 5. If a student wishes to withdraw from the college, he/she must apply for the same with the express consent of his/her father/guardian provided he/she has cleared his/her dues up to date.

Leave Rules:

- $1. \quad Leave for absence from the college should be applied for only when absolutely necessary.\\$
- 2. Leave should be secured personally before it is availed of. In case of serious illness, the leave application should be submitted to the college office immediately on return.
- 3. Application for leave should be made on prescribed forms available with the college office.
- 4. Leave application should be signed by the applicant's father/guardian.
- 5. A medical certificate should be attached with the leave application in case of long illness.
- 6. Leave upto 3 days will be granted by Tutor incharge and for a period of more than three days by the Senior Tutor/Principal.
- 7. A student is allowed leave for 12 days only during the full session and excess leave even if taken

with the sanction of the Principal will automatically be cancelled.

8. Students must pay their fees and return library books on the due date even if they are on leave. Leave of absence during the Examination days or Monthly Test shall be granted only by the Principal at his discretion.

Student's Diary-cum-Identity Card:

Every student of the college is required to get Student's Diary and to carry it on his/her person at all times. He/She must show the Diary on demand by a member of the staff. Defaulters will be penalised.

Cycle/Scooter/Car:

Those who pay cycle/scooter/car fee at the time of admission should hand over their cycle/scooter/car tokens to the caretaker. The college undertakes no responsibility in the case of unregistered cycles/scooter/cars. The college authorities are not responsible for the loss of a cycle/scooter/ cars without a proper lock.

Students are advised to park their cycle/scooters/cars in the cycle shed only. They should not place them on the road.

Discipline:

Whether inside or outside the college, every student is expected to look upon himself/herself as a custodian of the honour of the college and must conduct himself/herself in a way, worthy of the college.

The following would be considered gross breaches of discipline and would be severely dealt with:
(i) Disorderly conduct, (ii) Talking or shouting in the class, (iii) Smoking in the college premises,
(iv) Disfiguring of desks, walls or floors, (v) Damaging college property, (vi) Crossing college
lawns at unspecified places, (vii) Bringing of outsiders with doubtful character to the college,
(viii) Writing indecent and filthy remarks, (ix) Indulging in any rash or unbecoming behaviour,
(x) Using unfair means in the exams, (xi) Tearing or tempering with notices on the Notice Board.

Behaviour in Lecture Hall and Functions:

- 1. Students should be punctual and be in their seats well before the time of the commencement of the lecture/function.
- 2. They should stand up when the Principal, the staff and the chief guest enter the hall and should take their seats after the V.I.P.'s have taken theirs.
- 3. They should sit quietly during the lecture, avoid gossiping, whispering and unnecessary clapping or indecent expression and leave the hall in an orderly manner after the Principal, the staff and chief guest have left.
- 4. If it is very necessary to leave the hall during the function, the students should do so quietly at the end of an item without causing any disturbance.
 - Students are expected to observe the above rules. The students found guilty of gross misconduct or breach of discipline shall be liable to a drastic punishment such as heavy fine, cancellation of admission, withdrawal of admission form for the University examination, expulsion or rustication from the college, and so on, depending upon the seriousness of the offence.

Notices:

1. Only very important notices concerning all students are circulated. For the rest, students are expected to look up at the college notice board daily. Omission to do so may land negligent students in distress. Ignorance as a result of such omission is indefensible.

2. Notices, put on the college notice boards, which do not bear the signatures of Principal/Member of the teaching staff, shall have no validity. It is a very serious offence to put up notices without proper authority. To remove, tear off or temper with the notices on the college notice board is a punishable offence.

Migration:

- 1. Migration of students from other colleges and vice-versa is governed by the University rules.
- 2. The migrated student must bring with him/her:
 - (a) Lecture attendance report.
 - (b) Statement of marks obtained in the Tests.
 - (c) Character certificate from the Principal of the college concerned.
- 3. Provisional admission to the college, pending the Migration Sanction of the University is permissible.
- 4. After the migration has been sanctioned and notified by the University, the student must join the second college within 15 days.
- 5. The first college is entitled to charge tuition fee for the month in which the migration has been sanctioned by the University. The second college is not entitled to tuition fee for the month or part thereof.
- 6. The Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to authorise the migration from one college to another.
- 7. No Migration Certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with the University.
- 8. Students who migrate to the college would be required to pay full annual charges irrespective of the fact that they had paid these in the previous college. Annual charges like fees and funds paid to the college are non-refundable.

Code of Ethics for Students

The institution aims at teaching its scholars high sense of character, mutual tolerance, personal discipline and loyality to the nation, so that they may become true patriots and law-abiding citizens in their later life. To achieve this noble aim they will be required to impose on themselves voluntarily the following social and moral dictates-

- 1. Maintain perfect discipline in and outside the class-room. Attend all the college functions punctually and keeping perfect discipline throughout a function.
- 2. Be polite in dealing with one another, college employees and fellow passengers while travelling by a bus or train.
- 3. Accord full respect to your teachers and wish every teacher when you meet him/her for the first time in the morning.
- 4. Shift from one room to another in an orderly manner. Do not run or shout at one another. Do not rush into the room unless the class inside it has completely vacated the room.
- 5. Revise all your lessons daily at home and come prepared by reading the next day's chapter from the book. Do your home-work regularly and show it to the teacher.
- 6. Do not loiter about in the vacant periods. Read newspapers or general books in the library when you are free from the class work.
- 7. Smoking and drinking are strictly forbidden inside and outside the college campus. Do not fall into these bad habits.
- 8. Cleanliness should be observed at college as well as at home. The college property is your own. Therefore, do not spoil the walls or furniture by making marks on them. Pieces of paper etc. should be thrown into the rubbish bins.
- 9. Be peaceful with one another and do not pick up quarrels. However if any dispute arises, do not try to settle things by yourself. At once make a written report to the tutor incharge or the Principal who will investigate the matter and take suitable action against the offender.

- 10. Always form a queue when you want to meet the Principal or are paying your dues at the college office.
- 11. Do not take part in politics, rather conserve your energy and utilise it in reading, writing and other purposeful activities. No meeting without the permission of the Principal can be organised in the college campus.
- 12. Students should cultivate in their minds the spiritual values of life. "Enter to learn and leave to serve", should be their motto. Just as one Moon gives more light than all the stars and one Sun drives away the darkness from the space millions of times larger than itself, similarly one good student, whether he/she preaches or not by his/her very presence in the world sets in motion invisible good vibrations.
- 13. All the education received is reduced to nothing if it is not built on the foundations of a pure character. And the basic need of a student is but the formation of his/her character, which not only builds his/her own life, but also helps the nation to grow.
- 14. Each day of their life, should begin with a prayer to the Almighty to bestow upon them the strength to do their work honestly, earnestly and with dedication and devotion. They should have implicit belief that the blessings would bring peace and prosperity to them, as also the courage to face the challenges of life.
- 15. As per the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP(C) No.24295/2000 Ragging in the educational institution is strictly prohibited. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel the student from the institution.
